Follow the directions provided in the Call for Abstracts!

- The abstract must be well written; the clarity of the writing mirrors your thinking.
- Create an attractive, catchy title that captures the essence of the presentation.
- Choose verbs carefully; aim for passionate phrases using concise language.
- Write an introductory paragraph which describes the innovation historically.
- Provide some concrete details of the presentation to entice the reader to want to learn more.
- Have colleagues read the abstract before submission.
- Discuss how the presentation can impact nursing education, clinical practice, and/or future research.
